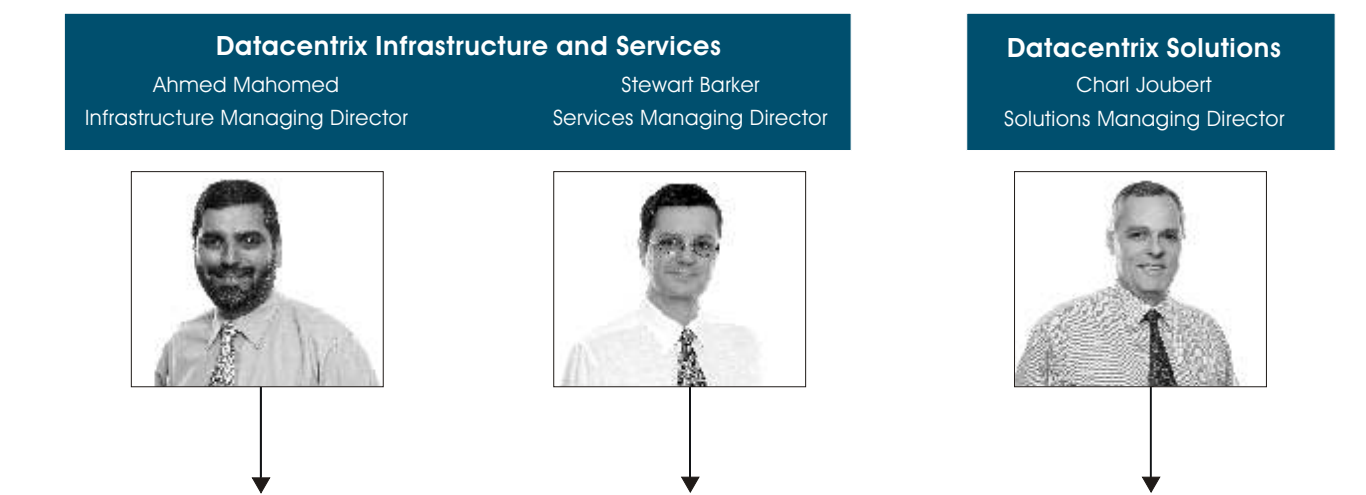

Datacentrix obtained BEE status by joining forces with black empowerment company Aka Capital (Pty) Ltd, previously Co-ordinated Network Investments (Pty) Ltd ("CNI"). Datacentrix assisted in establishing associate company, Vukani Technologies (Pty) Ltd, supplier of IT consumables. It is managed and controlled by black individuals, who own 51% of its equity.

Datacentrix secured regional representation in the Western Cape and KwaZulu-Natal with the acquisition of Langraphix Cape, a black owned service infrastructure company, and Network Architects respectively. Datacentrix acquired Supported Software (Pty) Ltd, a Johannesburg-based provider of top-end networking and mass storage solutions.

Appointments to the board of directors included Gary Morolo as executive chairman, Charl Joubert and Stewart Barker as executive directors and Imogen Mkhize as non-executive director.

Datacentrix was announced as the most empowered JSE-listed company in March 2003 by Empowerdex Economic Empowerment Rating Agency and was later awarded an "A" rating for its BEE credentials by the agency in October of the same year. Ahmed Mahomed and Elizabeth Naidoo were appointed as executive directors to the holdings board.

1994 Gerhard Uys (CEO) and Klaas Lammers (executive director) acquired the business from Datakor and changed its name to Datacentrix.

1997 Datacentrix was listed on the JSE Securities Exchange of South Africa ("JSE"). Gary Morolo was appointed as non-executive chairman to the holdings board. Other appointments included Gerhard Uys and Klaas Lammers as executive directors and Joan Joffe, Sam Nematswerani and Christoff Botha as non-executive directors.

1998 Datacentrix secured regional representation in the Western Cape and KwaZulu-Natal with the acquisition of Langraphix Cape, a black owned service infrastructure company, and Network Architects respectively. Datacentrix acquired Supported Software (Pty) Ltd, a Johannesburg-based provider of top-end networking and mass storage solutions.

1999 Datacentrix Solutions division was formed with the commencement of a five year contract with Premier Foods Limited.

2001 Datacentrix acquired Johannesburg-based S M NetworX (Pty) Ltd, supplier of IT infrastructure and related services. A broad range of content and network security solutions as well as software development and integration skills were also acquired.
